## Town of Seymour Resolution Declaring Emergency Resolution 05-14-24

STATE OF WISCONSIN Town of Seymour Outagamie County

The Town Board of the Town of Seymour, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, by this resolution, adopted by a majority of the town board on a roll call vote with a quorum present and voting and proper notice having been given, resolves and orders as follows:

An emergency is declared as existing within the Town of Seymour, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, for the following reasons:

The bridge on French Rd between Hwy 54 and Hwy G has been damaged due to a fiery vehicle accident and needs significant repair work completed. The current road construction on State Hwy 47 and State Hwy G has created additional traffic flow issues. It is important to get the bridge open to allow the transportation of critical goods to continue without additional delay and to have a safe route for vehicles.

The period of emergency shall be limited to the time during which the emergency conditions exist or are likely to exist in the Town of Seymour.

The town board, or its designated agents, has the authority to order whatever is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, welfare, and good order of the Town of Seymour during the emergency, including without limitation the power to bar, restrict, and remove all unnecessary traffic, vehicular or pedestrian, from the local highways.

Any person who violates a lawful order of the town board or its agents made under this emergency declaration shall forfeit not more than \$100 or, in default of payment of the forfeiture, shall be subject to imprisonment for 6 months for each separate offense.

The town clerk shall post this resolution under s.  $\underline{60.80}$ , Wis. stats. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption by the town board and the forfeiture penalties shall become effective upon posting.
